File Sharing...'tis the season to share

The basic premise we start with is, that there are files on one computer that you would like to make available to all of the computers on the network. What does "on the network" mean? Typically, this is the situation. You have some kind of high-speed internet access, and you

have a router. The router is what makes the internet available to all the computers that you have connected to it. Guess what? It also means that all the computers connected to the router, should be able to talk to each other. In the November issue, we covered this. So, if all the computers are in the same workgroup, and have different names, than the next step is to enable file sharing on the computer that has the files you want to share. Go to the folder that has the files, and right click on it. In the menu you get, choose "sharing and security". In here, you click on the link that says enable file sharing, and if you get a warning, choose, "just enable file sharing". Now you can choose "share this folder", and give it a name. To make it easy, use a short description that you will recognize from the other computers. Also, check the box "allow network users to change my files", and OK your way out of there. Now, go to one of the other computers, and open "My Network Places", and start looking for the new network share. In time, Windows will display the share automatically, but if you want to go there directly, go up to the address bar and type "//name of the other computer" and hit the enter key. What you should see now, operative word being should, is the folder being shared by the other computer. Double click to open it, and there are the files that are now being shared with the network. Word to wise, everyone on the network can now see those files, so backup often!


The indisputable fact, based on extensive research is: <u>traffic crashes are the leading cause</u> <u>of death in the workplace</u>.



Merchants: Be Alert

NEW YEAR: New Deals

With the New Year comes the opportunity for business owners to review the business for the past year and make changes for the upcoming year. Some changes are sought by the merchant. But some changes happen when someone contacts the merchant offering a business plan or contract for services. The services can range from advertising to financial services.

Know the Product. In the current business climate, salesmen can be particularly vigorous. The first issue for you is to know the product that is being proposed to you. What is the general product line is always the first question. Ask yourself:

How can you make a decision if you do not know the general product?

How can you decide if the proposal is a good one if you do not know the general product?

Compare Products. Taking your time to look around and compare products can have two benefits: 1) You can get a superior product and 2) You can save money on a cost-benefit analysis. After all, it's YOUR money.

Know the Vendor. Do you know the vendor, reputation of the vendor, local location of the vendor? Your opportunity to control matters for now and for the future ends when you sign the contract and give the vendor your money or access to your account for monthly billing.

Read the Contract. Occasionally I am approached by a person who has signed a contract and now find that it is a very bad financial deal. In difficult financial times, those bad deals can make a difference in the bottom line. But once the contract is signed, it is a done deal. Even a challenge to the contract can be an expensive legal battle since the vendor will not willingly surrender to you since others may follow your lead.


